

**COMMUNITY IMPACT STATEMENT**

The Board of the Studio City Neighborhood Council (SCNC) supports Council File 22-0390: Title, Catalytic Converters / Unlawful Possession Prohibition. According to the Los Angeles Police Department (LAPD), reported thefts of catalytic converters in the City of Los Angeles have increased year after year from 2018 to 2021, with 972 reported thefts in 2018, 1,198 reported thefts in 2019, 3,131 reported thefts in 2020, and 5,880 reported thefts in 2021. It is important that the City of Los Angeles take all necessary steps to curb the theft of catalytic converters. As such, the City Attorney is instructed to prepare and present a draft ordinance prohibiting the unlawful possession of catalytic converters, similar to those approved by the cities of Lake Forest, Desert Hot Springs, Mission Viejo, Irvine and others. In addition, the Studio City Neighborhood Council also supports catalytic converter etching events such as those sponsored by the LAPD.
