We also support the Urgency Clause making it effective upon publication; and consistent with California Government Code § 65858, the ICO shall run for 45 days, with a 10 month and 15 days extension by Council Resolution, and can be further extended for an additional 1 year, or until the adoption of the appropriate land use regulatory controls have been prepared by the Planning Department, adopted by the Council and become effective, whichever occurs first. We would also like to request that the following be added to the list of prohibited items: 1. Business License 2. Waivers or Variances 3. Truck Storage 4. Truck Repair & Maintenance 5. 
We would also like to request that the following be added to the list of prohibited items:
