Lincoln Heights does not have a homeowners association to lobby for our Hills like Mt Washington. Matter of fact we have one of the lowest homeownership rates in the city. We do not have a public elementary school that is 55 % white like Mt Washington. Hillside Elementary is Zero % white because it serves the community that is here and reflects the demographic. Maybe if Lincoln Heights was white then we could get some protections on our hills. Mt Washington / Montecito Heights weren't annexed to the city until 1912. They were subdivisions, planned communities. They are rail car suburbs. The constructions that are there didn't exist until later as well.

Lincoln Heights has not developed its hills since 1781 and prior. When do we get a cookie. These entities have sent speculators in our backyards and it's not ok. Community members are dying on the street. It's not ok to have mega mansions looking down onto poverty. Taking our green space in 90031. A visual physical reminder of Violence looming from above.

Lincoln Heights needs an HCR and ICO SUD in the name of equity and land justice. Perhaps the City of LA could do that for the 39,000 people here.
