Summary: Whereas, Coastal San Pedro Neighborhood Council has previously expressed serious concerns regarding the Sidewalk and Transit Amenities Program (STAP) and about digital signs in particular (see attached letters dated January 18, 2022 and January 27, 2020); Whereas, the program will involve the collection of individuals' personal data, and the City does not define what data will be collected, which vendors and/or City departments will have access to it, or how it will be used; Whereas, the program has moved forward for City Council review having been mis-represented to the public and without addressing critical concerns and questions raised during public outreach; Whereas, the further failure to produce an Environmental Impact Report and perform a full CEQA review is problematic, and the introduction of a new L.A. Municipal Code (LAMC) within the STAP Mitigated Negative Declaration is inappropriate, as there already is a dedicated LAMC to allow for advertising on the public rightof- way for transit shelters; Whereas, the failure to incorporate any formal avenues for input and consideration from Neighborhood Councils or from the local City Council District Offices on future placement of structures (in this program or in any new programs resulting from the new LAMC) is unacceptable. Resolved, the Coastal San Pedro Neighborhood Council opposes the action of the L.A. City Council related to digital signs in Council Files 22-0392, 21-0600-S110, and 20-1536. Be it further resolved, the Coastal San Pedro Neighborhood Council strongly opposes the collection of any person data in conjunction with this program.
