The reason for a new STAP was to address inequities in our bus shelters and street furniture, but now we know this program doesn't do that. Due to limited City funds, StreetsLA and Tranzito have explicitly stated that around 100 new shelters would have to go in "high ad revenue areas", leaving the rest of Los Angeles waiting for their buses in the heat without shade.

The CAO's report is pretty clear, STAP is fundamentally flawed and the City can simply not afford it, especially at a time when Los Angeles is experiencing a dual housing and homelessness crisis along with increased concerns about crime.

We support more bus shelters and street amenities in our neighborhoods, but why does the City want to plaster ad panels on every single element? Why change the LAMC without proper consultation with NC and community stakeholders? Advertising bus shelters are already permitted under the current LAMC.

City leaders have a responsibility to use funds in a way that addresses the city's most pressing needs. If these critical resources are diverted to non-priority areas, the public deserves to know why.

We urge you to reject the proposed Tranzito contract and design a new bus shelter program that meets our goals citywide and is financially responsible.
