

ENERGY, CLIMATE CHANGE, ENVIRONMENTAL JUSTICE, AND RIVER COMMITTEE REPORT relative to the feasibility of implementing an ordinance that would codify the sale of electricity by commercial Electric Vehicle (EV) charging companies directly to consumers.

Recommendations for Council action, as initiated by Motion (Koretz - De Leon):

1. INSTRUCT the Office of Finance, with the assistance of the City Attorney to report in 30 days on the feasibility of implementing an ordinance that would codify the sale of electricity by commercial EV charging companies directly to a consumer, or by prepayments of electricity in the form of a subscription or service/membership plan with electric vehicle manufacturers/retailers, as a business activity that falls within the retail sales category of the Los Angeles Municipal Code (LAMC), including, but not limited to; Potential budget impact associated with the reclassification of the sale on non-distributed electricity by electric vehicle charging companies as retail transactions, pursuant to LAMC Section 21.44.
2. REQUEST the City Attorney to transmit a draft ordinance in 30 days to codify the non-distributed sale of electricity by commercial electric vehicle charging companies as a retail transaction consistent with the retail sales category of the LAMC, including a December 31, 2027 sunset clause.

Fiscal Impact Statement: Neither the City Administrative Officer nor the Chief Legislative Analyst has completed a financial analysis of this report.
