Mission Road from Jesse Street to approximately 125 feet southerly thereof and Jesse Street from approximately 45 feet westerly of Mission Road northerly of Jesse Street to its westerly terminus – Resolution to Vacate - VAC – E1401195 – Council File No. 12-0458
