#### Recommendation

That the City Council note and file the Disaster Assistance Trust Fund Annual Financial Report for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2022.

## **Summary**

In accordance with Chapter 3, Division 8, Article 9.6, Section 8.72.1 (J) of the Los Angeles Administrative Code, the Office of the City Administrative Officer (CAO) prepared and submits herewith the required annual financial report regarding the Disaster Assistance Trust Fund (DATF) for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2022.

The DATF is administered by the CAO. All grant funds received for disaster relief public assistance and hazard mitigation assistance programs are deposited in the DATF. During Fiscal Year 2021-22, the CAO administered fifteen (15) active disaster recovery programs and two (2) hazard mitigation grants. Total revenues received during Fiscal Year 2021-22 amounted to \$35,329,689, including \$336,091 in interest earned on the fund balance. The interest amount is rounded to the nearest dollar.

Transfers and expenditures in the amount of \$29,660,663 were made for the purposes set forth in the grant programs during Fiscal Year 2021-22.

#### **Fiscal Impact Statement**

There will be no impact on the General Fund or other City funds as a result of adoption of the recommendation of this report.

The Office of the City Administrative Officer (CAO) is required to prepare and submit an annual report to the Los Angeles City Council on the results of operations of the Disaster Assistance Trust Fund (DATF), in accordance with the provisions of the Los Angeles Administrative Code (LAAC), Section 8.72.1 (J).

#### **BACKGROUND**

In December 1990, the DATF was created by Ordinance No. 166519, adding Section 8.72.1 (J) to Article 9.6 of Chapter 3 of Division 8 of the LAAC to meet accounting requirements for federal and state disaster assistance programs. The DATF designated as "Fund 872" in the City's Financial Management System is a Special Revenue Fund.

The primary enabling legislation for these disaster assistance programs are the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act (Stafford Act), Public Law (P.L.) 93-288 and the California Disaster Assistance Act (CDAA). Title 44, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 206 implements PL 93-288. California Code of Regulations, Title 19 implements the CDAA.

#### **SUMMARY**

The CAO administered fifteen (15) active disaster recovery programs and two (2) hazard mitigation grants in Fiscal Year 2021-22, as follows:

The total aggregate amount of federal and state disaster assistance grants received during Fiscal Year 2021-22 is \$34,993,599 (Schedule 1). During Fiscal Year 2021-22, the

DATF earned \$336,091 in interest on the fund balance (Schedule 2). This amount is included in the \$35,329,689 total receipts from all sources.

During Fiscal Year 2021-22, transfers to City departments, proprietary departments, and the General Fund totaled \$29,660,663 (Schedules 3 - 4). These are reimbursements for emergency and facility repair costs incurred by departments and allowed by federal and state agencies. The DATF reimbursed a total amount of \$263,134 to the General Fund in Fiscal Year 2021-22 for the CAO's administrative costs. The balance of \$29,397,529 reimbursed the Reserve Fund.

For Federal events, the recovery of project costs are based on management cost rates established by FEMA. The State of California Office of Emergency Services (CalOES) applies a fixed administrative allowance of ten percent to the state share of approved PWs. The administrative allowance is intended to help with the costs of requesting, obtaining and administering federal and state disaster assistance grants. Typical items that fall under the category of administrative allowance include costs for audits, consultants, bookkeepers, grant administrators, legal services and executive management. The DATF received \$37,886 in federal and state administrative allowances in Fiscal Year 2021-22. This amount is included in the \$35,329,689 total receipts from all sources. The interest amount is rounded to the nearest dollar.
