The city of Los Angeles funded this program through the Department of Transportation (LADOT) about two years ago. According to the data available, the city only installed only four permanent slow streets in the entire city. LADOT will need additional funding to continue this popular program, which will cost an additional \$720,000 to complete pending projects.

I encourage the city council to consider funding this program, and to allocate additional resources, funding and implement traffic calming methods throughout the city.

As a resident of Council District 6, I would like to see more traffic calming measures implemented in Sun Valley. We have a problem with street racing. We also need more bicycle infrastructure in the northeast San Fernando Valley.
