Subject: **REPORT BACK ON ALL INTERIM HOUSING SOLUTIONS OPEN WITHIN THE CITY OF LOS ANGELES AS OF JULY 1, 2022**

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**RECOMMENDATION**

That the City Council, subject to approval by the Mayor:

1. INSTRUCT the Los Angeles Homeless Services Authority (LAHSA) in coordination with the Office of the City Administrative Officer (CAO) to report back annually each January on all interim housing solutions open within the City of Los Angeles (City), including all City-funded and non-City-funded beds, as of December 31st; and
2. INSTRUCT the Los Angeles Housing Department (LAHD) in coordination with the CAO to report back annually each January on all permanent supportive housing in the City, including City-funded and non-City-funded units, as of December 31st.

**SUMMARY**

On January 27, 2022, the City Council instructed the CAO, to provide a report back on all interim housing solutions open within the City as of December 31, 2021 (C.F. 20-0841). This report recommends including LAHD for report backs on permanent supportive housing in order to have a full gauge on all housing solutions within the City.

LAHSA provided the following table, Table 1.0, which summarizes the number of IH beds citywide by the population served. From the information provided there are a total of 14,475 interim housing beds available throughout the City, with 379 as a subset of those beds that exclusively serve women. Per LAHSA these counts include beds that are not funded by the City or LAHSA.
