2022 OIS Incidents (January – June)

Incident Date	Incident Time	FID Case No.	Incident Type	Incident Description
1/10/2022	21:16	1-22	OIS - Hit	Three suspects approached an off-duty officer and his girlfriend and attempted to rob them. The officer and at least one suspect exchanged gunfire.
1/11/2022	20:14	2-22	OIS - No Hit	Hollenbeck patrol observed the suspect holding a firearm in his waistband and officers went in foot pursuit. During the foot pursuit, the suspect produced a firearm and an Officer-involved Shooting (OIS) occurred.
1/28/2022	13:20	3-22	OIS - Hit	Hollenbeck Narcotics Enforcement Detail officers observed a male armed with a firearm. The suspect ran from them, produced a firearm from his waistband and an OIS occurred.
2/1/2022	3:42	4-22	OIS - Hit	Foothill Patrol Division and Foothill Gang Enforcement Detail officers responded to the report of an "Assault with a Deadly Weapon (ADW) Suspect there now." The suspect charged at officers with knives and an OIS occurred.
3/29/2022	19:01	7-22	OIS - Hit	Newton patrol officers received a radio call of a male suspect pointing a handgun at a passerby. The first responding unit arrived at scene and observed the suspect. The passenger officer began to exit the police vehicle and an OIS occurred.
4/6/2022	14:26	8-22	OIS - Hit	Mission patrol officers responded to a radio call of an ADW. Officers encountered the suspect walking towards them in the driveway. The suspect charged at officers with a knife in his hands, resulting in an OIS.
5/3/2022	12:32	14-22	OIS - Hit	Central Patrol Officers responded to a Fire Department Backup request. The situation evolved into a Barricaded Suspect. Special Weapons and Tactics arrived at scene. The suspect moved to an open window of his apartment and fired one round from a 9mm handgun, which resulted in an OIS.
5/17/2022	13:45	17-22	OIS - No Hit	The suspect exited his vehicle armed with a firearm and carjacked a nearby vehicle. Rampart patrol officers initiated a vehicle pursuit of the suspect. During the pursuit, the suspect was involved in a second traffic collision which disabled his vehicle. The suspect exited the stolen vehicle, still armed with a firearm in his hand resulting in an OIS.
5/23/2022	18:41	19-22	OIS - No Hit	Newton Patrol officers observed a suspect armed with a handgun running east on the north sidewalk. The suspect pointed his handgun at the officers and fired, resulting in an OIS.
6/2/2022	8:59	20-22	OIS - Hit	Olympic Patrol officers received a radio call of an ADW suspect armed with a handgun. The officers went in foot pursuit of the suspect. During the foot pursuit, the suspect removed a handgun from his waistband, pointed it in the direction of the officers, and an OIS occurred.
6/8/2022	16:56	22-22	OIS - Hit	Hollywood Officers responded to a radio call of three Burglary suspects at a location. The officers went in foot pursuit of one suspect. During the foot pursuit the suspect pointed a gun in the officer's direction resulting in an OIS.
6/12/2022	3:25	23-22	OIS - No Hit	Newton uniformed personnel received a radio call of a Robbery. When officers arrived, they encountered the suspect. The suspect appeared to be armed with an edged weapon. The suspect advanced in the direction of one of the officers and an OIS occurred.
6/17/2022	9:32	26-22	OIS - Hit	Hollywood patrol officers responded to a radio call of an ADW suspect who pointed a gun at construction workers. The officers located the suspect who produced a handgun and fired at the officers, resulting in an OIS.
6/19/2022	22:47	27-22	OIS - Hit	Foothill patrol officers received a "415 Man with a Gun" radio call. The officers exited their police vehicle to make contact with the suspect. The suspect walked in the direction toward the officers and removed a firearm from his front waist area, firing at the officers, resulting in an OIS.
6/23/2022	0:28	28-22	OIS - No Hit	Southwest patrol officers observed a sedan traveling above the posted speed limit and conducted a traffic stop for the violation. As officers approached the vehicle, the suspect quickly exited the driver's side door, turned toward the officers with what the officers believed was a gun in his hand and an OIS occurred.
