**Comments for Public Posting:** I write in support of Sunset 4 All. I am a Los Feliz resident who commutes by bicycle. I am also a personal injury attorney who specializes in representing injured bicyclists and pedestrians. I frequently drive and bicycle on Sunset Blvd. Los Angeles is at a critical juncture. It needs to protect vulnerable road users like bicyclists and pedestrians. Automobile dependency has exacerbated the threats posed by traffic violence, climate change and housing crises. Tailpipe emissions account for 27% of our greenhouse gas emissions. We have devoted far too much of our landscape to moving vehicles, Angelenos spend way too much time stuck in traffic, and real estate is too expensive for many Angelenos. This City has imposed the cost of doing business on its most vulnerable road users. I have seen first-hand the devastating toll our dependence on automobiles takes on the bodies, lives and livelihoods of bicyclists and pedestrians. The cost of owning, maintaining, fueling and insuring motor vehicles is burdensome for many Angelenos, particularly those struggling to pay rent and student loans. Most trips are within three miles of travelers' homes. Bicycles are an obvious solution to these problems. But the painted bike lanes on Sunset do not protect bicyclists who use them. I have clients who have been injured in those lanes and other painted bike lanes, either by doors of parked cars opened into their path, or by cars intruding in the bike lane. Studies show that more people would bike if they felt safe. Sunset 4 All would protect bicyclists from these hazards and encourage more people to bike. This would remove cars from the road, mitigate greenhouse gas emissions and alleviate congestion. LA is way behind the rest of the world in implementing protected bike infrastructure. Please implement Sunset 4 All as soon as possible.
