Summary: Community Impact Statement for Council File 22-1311 Council File (CF) 22-1311 deals with the communications between the Los Angeles Homeless Services Authority (LAHSA) and the Los Angeles city Council. The City Council feels that “challenges persist, including inconsistencies in communication, District-level knowledge gaps, data-sharing limitations, and a slower overall rate of progress addressing homelessness than the City desperately needs. The lack of staff dedicated to facilitating communication between LAHSA and Council offices regarding programmatic operations has also created a disjointed approach across the City, with different Council offices working with LAHSA to varying degrees on homeless strategies and interventions.” The CF requests that LAHSA report back on creating new liaison positions assigned to Council Districts “to provide Council Offices with strategic communication, data and metrics, programmatic analysis, regional coordination, and district level knowledge and support.”. Additionally, the new liaisons should provide strategic communication, data & metrics, programmatic analysis, regional coordination, & District Level Knowledge and Support. These are great goals. We would add a few more items: -LAHSA should regularly be sending reps to all 99 NCs. Minimum of quarterly and monthly for those NC areas with homelessness in the excess of 500 people -Regular stats should be provided to break down the “monolith of homelessness” into “just needs a job”, “just needs a safe place to park”, “needs rehab”, “needs mental health assistance”, & several other categories, so that the problem of homelessness can start to be solved segment by segment -A bonafide strategy to end homelessness including step by step implementation
