

TRANSPORTATION COMMITTEE REPORT and RESOLUTION relative to the prohibition of oversized vehicles parking along both sides of Desmond Street, between Bradley Avenue and Dead End in Council District Seven (CD 7).

Recommendations for Council action, pursuant to Resolution (Rodriguez – Blumenfield):

1. ADOPT the accompanying RESOLUTION to prohibit the parking of vehicles that are in excess of 22 feet in length or over six feet in height, during the hours of 2:00 am and 6:00 am, along both sides of Desmond Street, between Bradley Avenue and Dead End, pursuant to Los Angeles Municipal Code Section 80.69.4, and the California Vehicle Code Section 22507.
2. DIRECT the Los Angeles Department of Transportation (LADOT), upon the adoption of the Resolution, to post signs giving notice of a "tow away, no parking" restriction for oversized vehicles, with the specific hours detailed, at the above locations.
3. AUTHORIZE the LADOT to make technical corrections or clarifications to the above instructions in order to effectuate the intent of this Resolution.

Fiscal Impact Statement: Neither the City Administrative Officer nor the Chief Legislative Analyst has completed a financial analysis of this report.

Community Impact Statement: None submitted.

Summary:

On January 25, 2023, your Committee considered a Resolution (Rodriguez - Blumenfield) relative to the prohibition of oversized vehicles parking along both sides of Desmond Street, between Bradley Avenue and Dead End in CD 7. According to the Resolution, there is an increased problem with oversized vehicles parking along several street segments where large vehicles are often parked overnight and constrict travel lanes, thereby creating dangerous situations. Pursuant to Los Angeles Municipal Code Section 80.69.4, and California Vehicle Code Section 22507, it is proposed that the parking of vehicles that are in excess of 22 feet in length or over 7 feet in height, during the hours of 2:00 am and 6:00 am, along both sides of Desmond Street between Bradley Avenue and Dead End be prohibited. After consideration and having provided an opportunity for public comment, the Committee moved to approve the Resolution. This matter is now submitted to Council for its consideration.
