**Comments for Public Posting:** I am an attorney and I reside within the City of Los Angeles. Many of my clients are cities, but Los Angeles is not a client. I strongly support the Municipal Lobbying Ordinance's ("MLO") passage because transparency leads to greater confidence in government. With greater confidence in government, we are able to work together better, to create a stronger City. The Council should also pass the MLO because it will lead to less City and insurance funds (including monthly fees and deductibles) being spent on lawsuits. I specialize in litigation and most lawsuits involving public entities cost at least \$100,000 in attorney's fees BEFORE going to trial. The MLO will save the City money by decreasing the chance lawsuits are filed, due to a decrease in improper and unethical communications between lobbyists and City personnel. This money may then be spent on projects all Los Angelenos desire, such as better streets, housing for low-income persons, and well-trained police officers.
