

MOTION

The city of Los Angeles has a number of beautification programs housed under various departments supported by different sources of funding. During the 2022 2023 budget deliberations, the Board of Public Works provided a budget memorandum on a comprehensive assessment of funding provided for all city beautification and cleaning programs that are similar in nature. With independent efforts from Clean LA, Clean and Green, Conservation Corps, Angeleno Corps, Los Angeles Bureau of Sanitation, and discretionary dollars through council office pilots, further coordination is needed to maintain these cleaning and greening efforts in a responsible manner.

It's in the resident's best interest to ensure that cleaning and greening efforts are properly coordinated and equitably distributed throughout Los Angeles. In areas that are disparately impacted, the City should take a comprehensive look at these individual programs and departments spending resources in those areas with the hope of better outcomes for cleaning and greening. Additionally, grant-funded beautification programs such as California for All Youth grant are ideal opportunities for the City to work with our youth with the hope of future engagement with city employment.


