Historic-Cultural Monuments are designated by the City of Los Angeles' Cultural Heritage Commission and confirmed by the City Council. The City currently has over 1,000 Historic Cultural Monuments, providing official recognition and protection for the City's most significant historic resources. Historic-Cultural Monument designation acknowledges noteworthy architecture or structures and sites associated with historic events or personages, recognizes buildings, structures, sites, or plant life as important to the history of the City, State, or Nation, and fosters civic pride. Council District 12 is home to numerous Historical-Cultural Monuments highlighting the rich history of the District.

I THEREFORE MOVE that the City Council direct the Department of Transportation to erect permanent ceremonial sign(s) at the following Historic-Cultural Monument located in Council District 12:

- March Avenue Palm Trees: Historical-Cultural Monument No. 1235 located in the Public Right-of-way in the median and along the east side of N. March Avenue between W. Ingomar Street and W. Justice Street.
