COUNTY VICTIM SERVICES (XC) PROGRAM GRANT AWARD

Attached is the Grant Acceptance Packet (Packet) for a grant award in the amount of \$1,346,620 from the California Governor's Office of Emergency Services (Cal OES) for the period from January 1, 2023 through December 31, 2023 for the Fiscal Year (FY) 2023 Los Angeles County Victim Services (XC) Program. There is no match requirement for this grant.

The total cost of the Victim Services Program is \$1,428,900, of which \$1,343,620 will be reimbursed to the General Fund by the County of Los Angeles as follows: salaries (\$503,422); fringe benefits (\$219,391); subrecipient agencies (\$606,000); and, operating expenses (\$14,807). The grant funding will provide ongoing support for one City Attorney Administrative Coordinator I, partial funding for one City Attorney Administrative Coordinator IV. The grant award will also support five full-time Witness Service Coordinators.

The remaining program cost of \$85,280 in related costs not covered by the grant will be offset by the Department's salary savings. No additional position authorities are requested at this time

As a participant in the Grants Pilot Program, the City Attorney's Office submitted the Packet for review and analysis by the City Administrative Officer (CAO) Grants Oversight Unit and the assigned CAO analyst. This Office reviewed the Packet for completeness, conducted a concise analysis, and prepared a Fiscal Impact Statement. The Packet consists of the following:

10. Grant Award Summary

The Office of the City Attorney requests approval to accept the Fiscal Year 2023 (FY23) Los Angeles County XC Program Grant in the amount of \$1,343,620 from the Cal OES for a grant performance period of January 1, 2023 through December 31, 2023. Funding for the XC Program Grant is provided through the federal Victims of Crime Act funds, with the Cal OES serving as the pass-through agency. Grant funding will be utilized in support of the Los Angeles County XC Program. The XC Program began in 2016 to help address gaps in victim services as identified by the Victim Services Steering Committee, which is composed of local stakeholders.

Grant funding will continue support of the XC Program, which has assisted 20,342 new and continuing crime victims since its inception. Staff has provided 18,966 assists with filing for the California Victim Compensation Board applications (of which 6,115 applications were filed); 17,429 referrals for information; 1,615 personal advocacy and accompaniment services; 5,168 emotional support or safety services; 2,875 referrals and assistance to shelter and housing services; and, 3,398 criminal justice system assistance services.

 - d. Upon receipt of grant funds, transfer up to \$219,391 from Fund No. 368, Department No. 12, Account No. 12W321 to Fund No. 100, Department No. 12, Revenue Source Code 5346 Related Cost Reimbursements from Grants; and,

Review of Grant Award and Acceptance Determination

The total cost of the Victim Services Program is \$1,428,900, and consists of \$1,343,620 in grant funds and \$85,280 in related costs not covered by the grant. The Department will absorb the cost of \$85,280 through salary savings. Therefore, there is no additional impact to the General Fund. The recommendations in this report complies with the City's Financial Policies in that grant funding will be used solely for grant-eligible expenditures to the extent possible. Program costs beyond the grant performance period will be subject to the availability of on-going revenues. The City's Financial Policies require that the City pursue federal, state and private grants, but strictly limit financial support of these programs to avoid commitments that continue beyond available funding. The recommendations in this report comply with City Financial Policies in that the proposed funding is balanced against established revenue approved by Council actions and from Federal and State grant receipts. All funding is subject to the availability of grant funds and determinations by Mayor and Council.

The total cost of the Victim Services Program is \$1,428,000, of which \$1,343,620 will be reimbursed to the General Fund by the County of Los Angeles as follows: salaries (\$503,422); fringe benefits (\$219,391); subrecipient agencies (\$606,000); and, operating expenses (\$14,807). Grant funding will fully support one City Attorney Administrative Coordinator II position, and partially fund one City Attorney Administrative Coordinator III, and one City Attorney Administrative Coordinator IV. The grant award will also fund five full-time Witness Service Coordinators. No additional position authorities are requested. There is no match requirement for this grant.

The remaining \$85,280 is for related costs and is not funded by the grant. The Department plans to offset this cost through salary savings. Therefore, there is no General Fund impact.

Subrecipient agencies provide enhanced, direct services to underserved victim populations and consist of community victim services agencies, City departments, and stakeholders who collaborate to identify and close gaps in City-provided victim assistance services. Partnering agencies include the Children's Institute, Journey Out, Peace Over Violence, the City of Los Angeles Department of Aging, and the Los Angeles Police Department. Each agency will be responsible for providing monthly reports to the City Attorney's office to ensure program objectives are met.
