

MOTION

I MOVE that the matter of the COMMUNICATION FROM THE MAYOR relative to transferring Opioids Settlement Trust Fund and Tobacco Settlement Trust Fund monies in the Fiscal Year 2023-24 Unappropriated Balance Fund, for an extended residential drug treatment pilot program for people experiencing homelessness Item No. 39 on today's Council Agenda (C.F. 23-0670), BE AMENDED to adopt the following two additional instructions:

***Mayor's Office *in writing**

3. REQUEST the Mayor to report to the Council by July 31, 2023 with a plan for expenditure of the Opioid Settlement and Substance Use Disorder Treatment Bed funding, including: the number and location of both existing and new beds for this purpose; the prioritization of eligible clients, including City residents residing in ABH and other interim housing; how appropriate level of service and treatment will be determined and offered, including in-hospital or sober living facilities; providers, including status of executed contracts, if any, and daily payment rates; metrics for evaluating program; and annual projection of anticipated receipts from Opioid and Tobacco Settlements, and likelihood of future impact to General Fund.

***and City Administrative Officer**

4. INSTRUCT the Chief Legislative Analyst to report to the Council by July 31, 2023, with recommendations for policies and programs that could be eligible for the Opioid Settlement and Tobacco Settlement funds, including prevention, early intervention, harm reduction (specifically overdose prevention), sustained in-patient or community-based treatments, or other programs to address opioid addiction
