ABIGAIL TAPANG ZELENSKI Principal, Zelenski Law, PC Commissioner, Los Angeles Commission on Civil Rights

Abigail Tapang Zelenski is the Principal of Zelenski Law, PC. For two decades, she has focused on labor and employment matters. She provides employment-law advice and counsel to businesses of all sizes, and has successfully represented clients in matters involving wage-and-hour matters, harassment, discrimination, and wrongful termination. Throughout her career, Abigail has been appointed as class counsel in over forty class actions, recovering on behalf of employees in the motion-picture, security, healthcare, food, retail, and banking industries, as well as on behalf of the California Labor and Workforce Development Agency.

In 2019, Abigail was appointed by Mayor Eric Garcetti, and confirmed by Los Angeles City Council, to serve as a Commissioner on the inaugural Civil and Human Rights Commission. In 2023, she was elected to serve as the Vice Chair, and was reappointed by Mayor Karen Bass to serve another term on the Commission. During her service on the Commission, Abigail has worked closely with LA Civil Rights and the Director of Enforcement on major tasks leading up to the launch of the Discrimination Enforcement Division, including providing input on the Civil Rights Commission Bylaws, the Administrative Rules and Procedure, and the online complaint platform. Abigail also served on an Ad Hoc Committee to create training resources for the Commission and the Department. In response to the unfortunate rise of anti-Asian hate, she worked with LA Civil Rights and the Philippine American Bar Association to organize and present on each of their Know Your Rights Trainings and Community Forums to educate the public on combatting discrimination and harassment.

Abigail currently serves as the Vice President on the Board of the non-profit organization Search to Involve Pilipino Americans, which produces programs for youth and families, including case management and counseling, senior programs, small-business development, cultural enrichment, and affordable housing in Greater Los Angeles. She also serves on the Board of Governors of the Philippine American Bar Association— the largest local association of Filipino American attorneys in the United States—and has held several roles on its Executive Board, including President in 2021 and Chair in 2022. Previously, Abigail served on the Governing Board of the Silver Lake Neighborhood Council. She also served as Vice President and a Board Member of the Filipino American Library and Filipino American Heritage Institute.

Abigail has been selected as a Southern California Super Lawyer for the past five years, 2019 through 2023 an honor given to only 5% of attorneys in California. For the six previous years, she was recognized as a Super Lawyers Rising Star. Each year, no more than 2.5% of young lawyers in California are selected to receive this recognition.

Abigail earned her J.D. from the UCLA School of Law, and graduated Phi Beta Kappa from the University of Southern California, magna cum laude, with a B.A. in Political Science.

Abigail resides in Los Angeles with her husband, child, and two rescue dogs.

Should this apply to your commission, you will be receiving a packet from the City Ethics Commission containing information about the City's conflict of interest laws, and a copy of the State Form 700/Statement of Economic Interests. You are required to complete and return this form <u>within 21 days</u> of your nomination to the City Ethics Commission via the California Fair Political Practices Commission's eDisclosure website, or by mailing the forms to City Hall at 200 N. Spring Street, 24th Floor, Los Angeles, California 90012. Any inquiries regarding this form should be directed to Nicole Enriquez at the City Ethics Commission by email at <u>nicole.enriquez@lacity.org</u>.

Additionally, you will be required to attend public meetings at City Hall where your reappointment will be considered. You will be hearing from our office and a City Council Clerk who will let you know when your reappointment will be considered by the Civil Rights, Equity, Immigration, Aging, and Disability Committee. Sometime thereafter, you will be notified of the date when your reappointment will be presented to the full City Council. Immediately following the meeting, you will again be required to take the Oath of Office in the City Clerk's Office located in Room 395 of City Hall. If you require parking for these meetings, please contact my Commissions team by email at myrcommissions@lacity.org.

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Per the City Charter, most commissioners must be registered voters of the City of Los Angeles, and must therefore reside within Los Angeles. If you move at any point during your term, or your contact information changes, please contact my Commissions team immediately at the email listed below. While we hope that you complete a successful term, if for some reason you intend to resign, please do so in writing to my Commissions team at myr-commissions@lacity.org.
