A lifelong resident of the San Fernando Valley, Nurit Katz is an educator and sustainability professional who cares deeply about creating a sustainable, resilient, and healthy region for all Angelenos.

Ms. Katz currently serves on the <u>Board of Water and Power Commissioners</u>. She has served in a number of public sector and non-profit advisory capacities including on the <u>LA 100</u> Advisory Group, <u>Los Angeles County Climate Vulnerability Assessment</u> Technical Advisory Committee and the Resilient Infrastructure Working Group for <u>Resilient LA</u>. She currently serves on the <u>Biodiversity Expert Council</u> for the City of Los Angeles, and the <u>Sepulveda Basin Wildlife Areas Steering Committee</u>.

As Chief Sustainability Officer for UCLA, Nurit Katz led the development of the university's first comprehensive sustainability plan and fosters collaboration across the leading public university to advance sustainability through education, research, operations, and community partnerships. For six years Ms. Katz also served as Executive Officer for Facilities Management for UCLA. Nurit has over 15 years of teaching experience and is an Instructor for the UCLA Extension Sustainability Certificate Program. She has also taught for the UCLA Institute of Environment and Sustainability and prior to UCLA worked in environmental and outdoor education.

Ms. Katz holds an MBA and a Masters in Public Policy from the UCLA, and a BA in Environmental Education from Humboldt State University. She is currently pursuing a PhD in Ecology and Evolutionary Biology at UCLA and was a Trainee in the National Science Foundation Research Traineeship (NRT) Innovation at the Nexus of Food, Energy, and Water Systems (INFEWS) program.

Nurit enjoys wildlife photography and urban ecology research and serves as the Outreach Coordinator for the <u>Los Angeles Raptor Study</u>, a community science-based study of nesting raptors (hawks, owls, and falcons), supported by Friends of Griffith Park.

Additionally, you will be required to attend public meetings at City Hall where your reappointment will be considered. You will be hearing from our office and a City Council Clerk who will let you know when your reappointment will be considered by the Energy and Environment Committee. Sometime thereafter, you will be notified of the date when your reappointment will be presented to the full City Council. Immediately following the meeting, you will again be required to take the Oath of Office in the City Clerk's Office located in Room 395 of City Hall.
