Dear Honorable Members,

I'm a bibliophile, phillumenist and ephemera collector under *Richard Hopp v. City of Los Angeles* (2010) 183 Cal. App. 4th 713; *Richard Hopp v. City of Los Angeles* (Super. Ct. LA County Nov. 13, 2008, BC401887) Stipulation for Entry of Judgment and Judgment, Jan. 18, 2012). *Hopp* is a case of first impression to define "business" and "dealer" at the appellate level vis-à-vis a stakeholder collecting, buying and acquiring secondhand goods and tangible personal property, including participating as a self-storage auction bidder. *Cf.*, Cal. Bus. & Prof. Code, §§ 21500, 21627.

As a stalwart self-storage auction-goer, the personal opposition is related towards the silent and scant *good faith purchaser* definition in LAMC § 49.85.1 that conflicts with a competing state statue. Cal. Bus. & Prof. Code, § 21711. The motion unwittingly imperils a good faith purchaser to unforeseen liability and unlawful mandates. *John Nist v. Steven Hall*, 2d Civil No. B284606 (Cal. Ct. App. May. 31, 2018). (emphasis added). Although, Cal. Bus. & Prof. Code, § 21712 precisely governs the relationship of the storage facility owner and occupant. *Halliburton v. Stadium Props., LLC*, B284848 (Cal. Ct. App. Mar. 22, 2019).

Adequate clarity is a prerequisite so that a good faith purchaser is neither implicated, incriminated, filed against nor subject to an administrative citation

(LAMC § 49.85.3), criminal prosecution, unfair business practices (Cal. Bus. & Prof. Code, § 17200 et seq.), and exposed to third party claims. Inconstant and conflicting laws cannot subsist and persist. *Broughton v. Cigna Healthplans of California*, 21 Cal.4th 1066, 90 Cal. Rptr. 2d 334, 988 P.2d 67 (Cal. 1999)

The nominal settlement of LAMC § 49.85.1 is bifurcate the section into subsections. The proposed amended language and the additional language <u>underlined</u> to read:

SEC. 49.85.1. DEFINITIONS.

- A. The following words and phrases, whenever used in this article, shall be construed as defined in Section 21701 of the California Business and Professions Code: "occupant," "owner," "personal property," "rental agreement," and "self-service storage facility." "Local emergency period" is the period of time from March 4, 2020, to the end of the local emergency as declared by the Mayor.
- B. <u>This article shall not apply to section 21711 of the California</u> <u>Business and Professions Code.</u>
