ORDINANCE NO. 186707

An ordinance adding Article 7 to Chapter XX and amending Section 61.07 of Article 1, Chapter VI of the Los Angeles A diludate of the Los Angeles Municipal Code to impose the maximum fine for depositing personal protective equipment onto the public right-of-way and/or into the storm drain system during

and/or into the storm drain system during the COVID-19 pandemic.

WHEREAS, the State of California and the City of Los Angeles have declared a state of emergency due to the novel COVID-19 virus pandemic (Pandemic);

WHEREAS, as a result of the Pandemic, the City has taken extraordinary processing to perster the public health.

WHEREAS, as a result of the Pandemic, the City has taken extraordinary measures to protect the public health, safety, and welfare of its residents; WHEREAS, in accordance with current safety orders, including the Mayor's "Safer at Home" emergency order, and the guidance of other local and national health organizations, City residents and people working within the City have increased their use of personal protective equipment (PPE) when engaging in public activity to reduce the risk of infection; WHEREAS, with the increased use of

activity to reduce the risk of infection; WHEREAS, with the increased use of PPE, residents have expressed concerns of increased littering and depositing of discarded PPE onto the City's public right-of-way and into the City's storm drain system, including in City streets, sidewalks, and gutters; and WHEREAS, the City is especially concerned with this observed activity since discarded PPE may be contaminated with COVID-19 such that the contaminated material may come in

the contaminated material may come in contact with unsuspecting residents and

Section 1. A new Article 7 is added to Chapter XX of the Los Angeles Municipal Code as follows:

ARTICLE 7

DEPOSITING OF PERSONAL PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT
DURING COVID-19 PANDEMIC
SEC. 200.80. DEFINITIONS.

The following definitions shall apply to this article:

A. "City" means the City of Los Angeles. B. "Deposit" means any release, discharge, dumping, placement, littering,

or disposal.

C. "Face Covering" includes, but is not limited to, any medical grade or non-medical grade face masks made from any material (such as paper or fabric), face shields, or face coverings (such as

"Personal Protective Equipment" means any Face Covering, eye protection,

gloves, or gowns.

D. "Public Right-of-Way" means land that is dedicated for public use including, but not limited to, streets, sidewalks, curbs, or

parkways, or dedicated unimproved areas. E. "Storm Drain System" means any E. Storm Drain System means any facilities or any part of those facilities, including streets, gutters, conduits, natural or artificial drains, channels, and watercourses that are used for the purpose of collecting, storing, transporting, or disposing of stormwater and are located within the City.

200.81. NO DEPOSITING PERSONAL PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT. It shall be unlawful for any person to Deposit Personal Protective Equipment into the City's Public Right-of-Way or Storm Drain System.

SEC. 200.82. ENFORCEMENT

Each violation of this article is punishable as an infraction in the amount of \$250. SEC. 200.83. CONFLICTS.
Nothing in this article shall be interpreted

or applied so as to create any power or duty in conflict with any federal or state

law. SEC. 200.84. SEVERABILITY.

If any subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this article is for any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this ordinance. The City Council hereby declares that it would ave adopted this section, and each and every subjection, sentence, clause and phrase thereof not declared invalid or unconstitutional, without regard to whether any portion of the ordinance would be subsequently declared invalid or unconstitutional. unconstitutional. SEC. 200.85. SUNSET

This article shall sunset upon the later of either the Governor of California lifting the State of Emergency he declared on March 4, 2020, or the Mayor of Los Angeles lifting the Declaration of Emergency he declared on March 4, 2020.

Sec. 3. URGENCY CLAUSE. The City
Council finds and declares that this
ordinance is required for the immediate
protection of the public peace, health, and
safety for the following reason: In order for
the City of Los Angeles to ensure that its
public areas are in clean, sanitary, and
accessible condition, and to promote the
public health and safety by ensuring that
public areas remain readily accessible for
their intended uses, it is necessary that paragraph Sec. 3. L public areas remain readily accessible for their intended uses, it is necessary that the amendments to the Los Angeles Municipal Code as reflected in this ordinance must become effective as soon as possible. For all these reasons, the ordinance shall become effective upon publication pursuant to Los Angeles City Charter Section 253.

Sec. 4. The City Clerk shall certify to the passage of this ordinance and have it published in accordance with Council policy, either in a daily newspaper published in accordance with Council policy, either in a daily newspaper circulated in the City of Los Angeles or by posting for ten days in three public places in the City of Los Angeles: one copy on the bulletin board located at the Main Street entrance to the Los Angeles City Hall; one copy on the bulletin board located at the Main Street entrance to the
