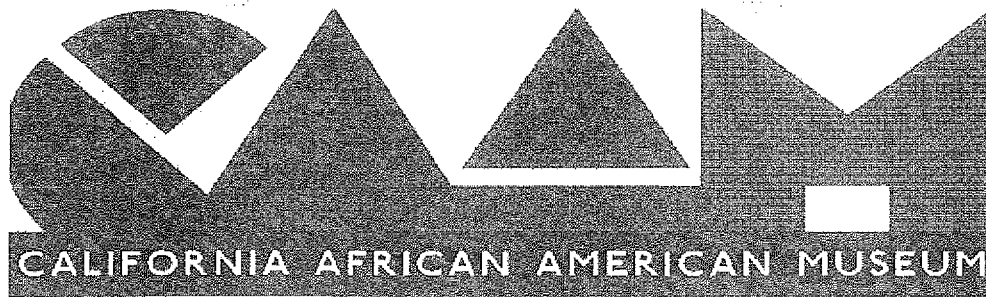

CHARMAINE JEFFERSON

Charmaine Jefferson is Executive Director the California African American Museum (CAAM), a statewide agency in Los Angeles' Exposition Park, and Executive Vice President of its 501(c)(3) nonprofit partner Friends, the Foundation of the California African American Museum*. She is a second term gubernatorial appointee to the California Arts Council; Board Director of Arts for LA; and, Trustee of the California Institute of the Arts where she also serves on the Finance and Trustee Nominating Committees.

A former professional dancer and an attorney, Ms. Jefferson has always provided strong administrative leadership and content support to all the arts. She holds a B.A. degree in dance from UCLA, an M.A. in dance education from NYU, and a law degree from Georgetown University Law Center. She was a Sr. Dance Program Specialist with the National Endowment for the Arts; Executive Director of Dance Theatre of Harlem; Deputy and twice Acting Commissioner of Cultural Affairs for the City of New York; Vice President of Business Affairs for dePasse Entertainment; and Director of Show Development for Disney Entertainment Productions.

An active and passionate advocate for the arts and civic engagement, she served four years on First Lady Maria Shriver's *Minerva Award Selection Committee* and recently served as a Co-Mentor to the inaugural 2010-2011 class of Los Angeles City Fellows under former Deputy Mayor Austin Beutner's Office of Economic and Business Policy. In 2011, Charmaine was honored by the International Association of Blacks in Dance in January; named KCET & Union Bank's 2011 Local Hero for Black History Month; and received the Integrity Award from the Los Angeles Women's Theatre Festival in March 2011.

Dear Ms. Jefferson:

I am pleased to inform you that I hereby reappoint you to the Cultural Affairs Commission for the term ending June 30, 2017. In order to complete the process as quickly as possible, there are several steps that must be taken, many of which require a trip downtown. If you require parking during these procedures, please call Sui Duong in my Office at (213) 978-0724 and he will arrange it for you.

To begin the appointment process, please review, sign and return the enclosed City Commissioner Ethics Pledge, Commission Remuneration Form, Undated Separation Form and Background Release **within one week** of receiving this letter. These documents are necessary to help us ensure the most efficient, open and accountable City government possible.

Under separate cover you will be receiving a packet from the City Ethics Commission containing information about the City's conflict of interest laws and a copy of the State Form 700/Statement of Economic Interests. City law requires that you complete and return this form **within 21 days** of your nomination to the City Ethics Commission, 200 North Spring Street, City Hall, 24th Floor, Los Angeles, California 90012. Any inquiries regarding this form should be directed to Shannon Prior at the Ethics Commission at (213) 978-1960.

As part of City Council confirmation process, you will need to arrange a meeting with Herb J. Wesson, your Councilmember, and Councilmember Richard Alarcon, the Chair of the Arts, Parks and Neighborhoods Committee, to answer any questions they may have. You will be hearing from a City Council committee clerk who will let you know when your appointment will be considered by the Arts, Parks and Neighborhoods



Committee. Some time thereafter, you will also be notified by the committee clerk when your appointment will be presented to the full City Council for confirmation. Once you are confirmed, you will be required to take the oath of office in the City Clerk's Office, Room 395, City Hall. Deputy Mayor Aileen Adams's staff will be responsible to assist you during the confirmation process if you have questions.

Commissioners must be residents of the City of Los Angeles. If you move at any point during your term, have any changes in your telephone numbers, or in the future plan to resign (resignation must be put in writing), please contact my office immediately.
