Appointment of Charmaine Jefferson to the Cultural Affairs Commission**

FOR COUNCIL CONSIDERATION

Dear Councilmembers:

On January 17, 2012, the Mayor transmitted to the City Clerk a letter indicating his appointment of Ms. Charmaine Jefferson to the Cultural Affairs Commission. The City Council confirmed her appointment on February 15, 2012, and the Ethics Commission received Ms. Jefferson's pre-confirmation statement of economic interests (SEI) on March 28, 2012. This letter is provided for inclusion in the City Council file. A copy of this letter is also being provided to Ms. Jefferson, to help her avoid potential conflicts of interests that may arise in the course of her tenure as a member of the Cultural Affairs Commission.

Ms. Jefferson reports on her SEI income from Friends, the Foundation of the California African American Museum, for her position as executive vice president. She also discloses an ownership interest in her spouse's talent management company, Underground Sound Artists. If a matter involving any of these interests comes before the Cultural Affairs Commission, Ms. Jefferson should, before acting, seek the advice of the City Attorney regarding whether she should disqualify herself. We are unable to assess if or how frequently Ms. Jefferson would be in a position of having to recuse herself.


Interests disclosed on an SEI are not the only interests that can give rise to a conflict of interests. For example, state law may require recusal by a board or commission member due to certain business activities of the clients of that member's employer. Additionally, recusal may be required under City Charter § 222, which states that the City Attorney may provide a written opinion concerning the obligation of a City official to refrain from acting on a matter when it may violate state law or when action may not be in the public interest.

If a matter raises a potential conflict of interests, we encourage Ms. Jefferson to seek the advice of the City Attorney before acting. If Ms. Jefferson is required to disqualify herself from acting on a matter, Los Angeles Municipal Code § 49.5.6(J) and Executive Directive 2005-1 require her to file the enclosed Recusal Notification Form (CEC Form 51) with the Ethics Commission and the Mayor's office. If a board or commission member is disqualified from acting on three or more agenda items in a year because of a conflict caused by the same interest, the Ethics Commission is required by City Charter § 707 to review the conflict. If the Ethics Commission determines that the member has a significant and continuing conflict of interests, it must order divestment of the interest that is causing the conflict.

In addition to reviewing a nominee's SEL, the Ethics Commission also verifies that the nominee is a registered City voter. We have received a completed Residence Verification Form for Ms. Jefferson, which affirms that she is registered to vote in the City.
